



Dry Seasons Supports

Farm Drought Support Grants

The Victorian Government is providing practical support to farmers impacted by drought.

The Farm Drought Support Grants (formerly On-Farm Drought Infrastructure Grants) program is available to assist primary production businesses to implement on-farm infrastructure improvements and undertake essential business activities that improve drought.

Eligible farmers will receive up to \$5,000 (ex-GST) as a cocontribution grant that will support activities including water infrastructure upgrades (such as pipes, tanks, troughs and dams), stock containment areas, and grain and fodder storage.

One-on-one farm advisory service

All farmers, anywhere in Victoria, can register for a free consultation with a farm management specialist.

The advisory service offers a session of up to 3 hours (face-to-face or online) and a follow-up call, to help farmers take stock and develop a plan for managing drought conditions.

The advice is suited to your situation, from a consultant that you nominate from the registered panel.

Agronomists, livestock nutritionists, veterinarians, pasture and grazing specialists and farm business advisors, can support you with:

- feed and water budgeting
- farm safety and workload management
- farm business and financial management
- soil health and pasture re-establishment
- animal health and welfare, and more.

Gippsland Soil School

The Gippsland soil school is a new, region-wide farmer education initiative co-led by Gippsland Agricultural Group (GAgG) and the East Gippsland Catchment Management Authority. The school is designed to break down the silos between **different soil management approaches** – drawing on the best of conventional, regenerative, precision, and biological soil management systems to equipe our farmer to manage soil better in their unique farming and soil systems

This program integrates knowledge across soil chemistry, biology, and physical structure – along with a little bit of human psychology – to help farmers make better decisions. By **increasing confidence and capability**, participants will learn how to spend their annual amendment and fertiliser budgets more wisely, unlocking stronger plant growth and better returns.

Program structure



The Gippsland Soil School is delivered in **8 modules** across **4 x 2-day training blocks over 12 months**. The program includes practical, paddock-based learning, interactive workshops, and expert guest speakers. Victorian Trees on Farms Program

Closes 30 June 2026

The VToF is a new program offering grants to rural landowners seeking to integrate trees into their land. The VToF brings together the former Victorian Carbon Farming Program and the Gippsland Farm Forestry Program.

To be eligible for funding, projects must be "implementation-ready". That means applicants must **demonstrate their capacity** to plan for and deliver the relevant design and site preparation requirements, including logistical matters such as seedling ordering and purchasing.

Landowners **can get support** to be implementation ready via the Incubator Program, or via a professional services rebate.

VToF projects are flexible to support the individual motivations of landowners:

- Farm forestry plantings are eligible for up to \$4,000 per hectare, capped at \$80,000.
- Integrated environmental plantings are eligible for \$2,000 per hectare, capped at \$40,000.

A higher funding rate is made available to farm forestry projects on account of the pruning and thinning requirement necessary to produce high-value timber.

Landowners can choose to incorporate both types of plantings across different blocks within the one project.

VToF Round 1 is open until 30 June 2026, or until funds are exhausted. Find out more about the program on the website: https://agriculture.vic.gov.au/vtof

Plantings for VToF projects will generally be established according to the following planting regimes:

• Shelterbelts/timberbelts – A strip of trees, at least 10 metres wide, strategically planted to shelter livestock, crops, and pastures from the elements and some bio-security risks, as well as producing timber products in future years.

- Woodlots Small scale plantations established for timber production, generally between 3 and 20 hectares and established at a relatively high density.
- Wide spaced plantings Trees planted several metres apart (minimum 400 trees/hectares) to enable effective grazing of livestock (once trees are of sufficient size) or growth of crops, whilst producing timber.
- Integrated environmental plantings, such as those that buffer riparian corridors, or are established on less productive parts of the land, with the purpose of combating erosion or salinity, increasing biodiversity, pollination, or other environmental services.

Trees on Farms Incubator Program

Closes 17 October 2025

The Trees on Farms Incubator Program supports communities of rural landowners to receive in-depth training and planning advice that will help strengthen their technical knowledge and informed decision-making.

The program invites applications from organisations or entities, with the capacity to design and deliver a customised suite of activities that address the practical, technical, and strategic aspects of tree growing - including risks and opportunities of establishing and managing trees on farms.

Under the Incubator Program, you can apply for up to \$50,000 (excl. GST) in grant funding to deliver an incubator project over a period of up to 12-months.

Examples of activities that can be delivered by an Incubator project include:

- Coordination activities: landowner network meetings or on-site visits.
- Education activities: visits to demonstration sites or timber mills and processors, or delivery of tree-growing courses.

Changes for businesses from 1 July 2025

A number of important updates came into effect on 1 July in relation to operations, staffing, and finances. Here's a quick snapshot from Business Australia:

- Wages & Super
 - National Minimum Wage rises 3.5% to \$24.95/hr or \$948/week
 - Superannuation Guarantee increases to 12% (final scheduled rise)
 - Super will also be paid on government-funded Paid Parental Leave

 - ATO interest charges can no longer be claimed as tax deductions
- Energy Rebate
- Eligible small businesses get \$150 in electricity rebates (split over 2 bills)
 - Right to Disconnect
 - From 26 August 2025, small business employees can refuse contact outside work hours
 - Government Procurement
 - Sustainability requirements extended to furniture, ICT, textiles valued at \$1M+
 - Visa & Labelling
 - Skilled visa income thresholds increase
 - New country of origin seafood labelling rules starts 1 July 2026 (transition begins now)
 - Other Updates
 - New merger notification laws (voluntary from July, mandatory Jan 2026)
 - Small tax practitioners face new Code of Conduct rules
 - Updated R&D Tax Incentive form launches 15 August 2025

National Farm Safety Week

They're the jobs we push through at the end of the day. The early mornings after a late night. The can't-wait tasks in the middle of sowing, harvest, shearing or packing. Fatigue is one of the most under-recognised safety risks in Australian agriculture and it's costing lives.

The message is simple: the 'just keep going' culture isn't working.

"Fatigue has long been normalised in agriculture," says Farmsafe Chair Felicity Richards. "We don't think twice about the 18-hour day. We shrug off brain fog, forgetfulness, dropping things or zoning out as just part of the job. But when you're tired, your decision-making suffers.

You cut corners. You miss steps. You make mistakes. And in this environment, mistakes can be fatal."

This year's <u>Safer Farms Report</u> paints a clear picture. After recording the lowest on-farm fatality figure in 2023 (32 deaths), the sector was rocked in 2024 by 72 fatalities, the highest figure in over two decades. Severe injuries, meanwhile, have remained consistently high for more than a decade. Richards says fatigue is a critical factor hiding behind many of these events.

"It doesn't always show up in the incident report but ask any farmer, and they'll tell you about the time they nearly rolled a machine, misjudged a gate, forgot a safety step or lost their footing after days of little sleep.

Farmsafe is **encouraging teams and families to speak more openly about fatigue** and warning signs.

Some of the campaign's key fatigue reminders include:

- Make time for the plan, not just the job a short pre-job check can prevent long-term consequences.
- Don't let deadlines drown out danger one honest conversation beats one emergency phone call.
- Build in time for safety schedule backup and build buffer days into pressure periods.
- Call the huddle a quick check-in can reveal risks someone else might not see.

National Renewables in Ag Conference

Five East Gippsland headed to the annual conference, Emma Orgill, Josh Puglisi, Lily & Riley McCole and myself. This conference organized by *Karin Stark* brings together the latest information and discussions on the transition to renewable energy now underway in agriculture. The *key message* that was communicated was that the transition is happening and needs to continue as the old fossil fuel-based system is aging, has fluctuations, uses higher energy and has extended outages. Moving to a clean system (wind, solar, battery storage and grid upgrades) is a natural progression.

Sessions included *Fact & Fiction* which tackled common misinformation in the renewable energy debate, myths about wind turbine pollution, battery storage safety, the real impact Australia can have on global emissions and the scale of China's massive renewable transition. The *farmer showcases* featured Mike Casey (NZ) who has fully electrified his farm, proving that switching away from diesel not only cuts emissions it also improves profitability, Sandra from Wilandra Gippsland, who has installed solar irrigation on her dairy farm which is well on the way to paying itself off and KiaOra piggery which captures biogas from manure to power the farm.



The discussion about transitions covered the benefits communities are seeing that have begun the transition both social and economic, including construction phase and ongoing, that power transmission lines/ wind turbines take up very small amounts of farmable land when in place and tax and insurance considerations.

The *president of the VFF spoke* on the need to get the comms clearer and the importance of supportive language to assist the community to grasp this space.




